UNN Celebrates 56th Founders' Day in Style

Princess Alexandra of Kent in October 7, 1960 laid the foundation stone of the University of Nigeria. Every October, staff, students, alumni and friends of the university gather at the same venue where the foundation was laid to celebrate and reminisce the visions of the founding fathers of the institution led by Rt. Hon. Nnamdi Azikiwe.

Besides recounting nostalgic memories of the formative years of the university, the gathering, popularly known as "Founders' Day" provides platform for the university administration to bring the alumni upto-date with events, developments and challenges of their Alma Mater.

This year, 2016, the University of Nigeria celebrated her Founders' Day in style. The celebration had a touch of innovation in the activities which spanned for one week. The event featured the Minister of Science and Technology, Dr Ogbonnaya Onu as a guest lecturer. Onu treaded on a familiar terrain as he spoke on the topic; "Science, Technology and Innovation: the way forward".

The Minister lamented that the neglect of science, technology and innovation since Nigeria's independence had inflicted unprecedented harm on the country's national development and left Nigeria trailing behind lesser endowed Sub-Saharan countries in the field of innovation.

"We must aim to use science and technology to create wealth for our people, reduce poverty and work towards eliminating abject poverty, build an inclusive, competitive and sustainable diversified economy",

the Minister advised.

Alumni Day and Dignity of Man lecture was an integral part of the Founders' Day. Lecturers that feature in the event are usually shopped from the pool of distinguished alumni of the university. The Chief Judge of Anambra State, Justice Peter Umeadi presented the 8th Dignity of Man Lecture during the 2016 Founders' Day.

Justice Umeadi, who spoke on "The Rule of Law as the Foundation of any Nation", called for the domestication of Child Rights Acts by all the states in Nigeria, in line with changing times and development in the country. He advised legislatures to prioritise the greater good of the people while enacting laws.

"It should always be borne in mind that the good of the people and strengthening of the foundation of the nation ought to be the purpose of legislation which is then enforced by the ordinary courts", the Judge said.

The Commissioner of Police, Enugu State, Emmanuel Ojukwu, while discussing the lecture, noted that corruption was a major impediment to the observance of the rule of law which, according to him, was often recited in theory but absent in practice.

In his address at the alumni day, the

Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Benjamin Ozumba said that the University of Nigeria under his watch was making strides in line with the vision of the founding fathers.

He outlined part of the achievements of his administration within the past two years to include: improved global ranking by WEBOMETRICS which placed the University of Nigeria first in the country and among the best in Africa; entering into strategic collaborations to expose staff and students of the University to International best practices; completion of stranded buildings and revitalizing moribund establishments including the Faculty of Agriculture farm. "Despite economic Challenges in the country" The Vice-Chancellor said "we are resilient and resolute in giving the University of Nigeria a facelift. Such was the spirit of our founding fathers"

At the Nnamdi Azikiwe Library, an exhibition was mounted where departments, faculties and institutes showcased their latest inventions and research publications. On display were Solar water heater with fibrereinforced plastic storage tank; incinerator for converting solid waste into energy for domestic hot water generation; Biomass cookstoves; Thermo-syphon water heater;

paintings; fabrications and textile materials.

Arecent addition to the activities of the Founders' Day was the Dignity of Man Debate by students. The target of the debate, according to the coordinator, Prof Edith Nwosu was to prepare students for public speaking and critical thinking. "Our expectation is that one day, our students will debate in the British Parliament", she said.

The celebration was not lacking in entertainment as the institution's Department of Music staged a night of music concert. The Department, which recently emerged the best department of music in Nigeria at the Campus Classical

held at the University of Lagos, played different symphony ranging from Western Dance, African Chorus to African Instrumental. The Music night was capped with African danced drama titled Economic Palaver and Jungle Justice.

The Department of Film and Theatre Studies equally staged a drama show captioned "IyiUwa". The drama

captures the folklore of "Ogbanje" myth in Igbo cosmology where a girl dies and reincarnates repeatedly until the umbilical cord linking her with the spirits is severed by unearthing a ritual token called "IyiUwa"

The celebrations were capped with a thanksgiving service at Chapel of Redemption, University of Nigeria, Enugu Campus.

The Vice-Chancellor, UNN, Prof Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba, while delivering his speech at the Princess Alexandra Auditorium, Applauded the Department for their wisdom and effort to organise the maiden edition of the Prof. Chimere Ikoku Memorial Lecture.

According to him, the event was an opportunity to appreciate service to humanity of which Prof Ikoku was a Pathfinder, as his service to humanity spans across spheres of life. "my administration is committed to human developmental building platforms for moulding greater men and women who would soar our great Institution and country to a greater height just like our late Professor did before his demise", he said. Also, Prof Ozumba revealed that the late Professor was a scholar and a great Leader who served as a twotime Vice-Chancellor in the University of Nigeria and other Universities, thus he accomplished a great feat by leaving an indelible foot print in the sands of time.

The Chairman of the Occasion, Prof. Oleka Udala urged the youth to keep studying chemistry in order to propel life, As chemistry is about life while Biology is about human which inturn will help to uphold the legacy of Prof Ikoku.

Furthermore, he enlightened students and the academia of the need to practice knowledge without borders, citing an example with the Doctors without Borders

(DWB) group which was formed in 1971 by a group of French physicians whose aim was to travel across destitute and dangerous Countries to care for people's health and combat any injustice they encounter.Prof. Udala stated that if knowledge was not crisscrossed it could be catastrophic; hence

he called for the need for every profession to jointly work together and emulate the group of Physicians (DWB) to move the Nation forward. Moreso, the Vice-Chancellor, Usmanu Danfodio University, Sokoto, Prof. Abdullahi Abdu Zuru who delivered the keynote address titled: Chimere Ikoku: Chemist. Scholar and Statesman, spoke on how the Late Chemist imparted lives such as his in the field of Chemistry.He revealed that Prof Chimere prepared him for the challenges of life without claiming credit for it emphasizing that he spent his life helping unknown persons realise their potential before his demise. According to Prof. Zuru, the Late Prof. Ikoku Was a good lecturer whose class was always serious. Attentive and most times embellished with jokes which made it

"Prof Ikoku was a man of considerable experience who has through the years assiduously amassed a great deal of working knowledge of a wide range of activities, with a high sense of responsibility, which made him able and willing to accept additional responsibilities done with vigour", he said.

Speaking at the event, the son of Late Prof Chimere Ikoku, Mr Ikenna Ikoku expressed delight over the honour given to the memory of his father by the University of Nigeria.

He buttressed that despite the contributions of the father to the University, he also believed that people should be involved to boost the commitment of enlightening the human mind.Mr Ikenna Ikoku emphasized that his father's drive of contributing to the world of science through his field of study, was to enhance national and human development which made him show concern on Africans and wanted the average African to be exposed to science.He stressed that his father's father's

memory was a treasure he would behold forever, as he explained that he was a great disciplinarian who raised them under certain codes and conducts, teaching him and his siblings to stay away from crime because according to him the mere thought of a crime is an offence and criminal.

It was a beehive of activities at

the University of Nigeria as the premier Institution celebrated its 46th Convocation in grand style conferring about 12,448 degrees on deserving graduands.

The Convocation activities, which spanned from Monday, 23rd to Sunday 29th January 2017, attracted dignitaries from different parts of the country who either came to felicitate with their friends, wards or attended as special guests of the University.

Activities for the convocation was flagged-off at the Main Hall of the University of Nigeria, Enugu Campus where the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba outlined the convocation events and briefed pressmen and members of the university community of major developments in the university within the past one year.

Ozumba informed the Prof. audience that the University had consolidated its primus position in the latest Webometric rankings which still placed the University of Nigeria in the number one position among all the universities in Nigeria with over 4000 differences in citation between the Institution and the University of Ibadan that occupies the second position.

"Having retained that enviable position consecutively for three rankings, we now consider it a privilege to remain at the top and we are not ready to abdicate that position anytime soon", the Vice-Chancellor said.

At the conferment of first Degrees, Certificates and Diploma, a total of 10425 graduands received first degrees, diplomas and certificates, 94 of them bagged 1st Class Honours Degree with Eke Ifeanyichukwu Emmanuel of the of the Department of Microbiology

"As a student, I had no shoes, I did menial jobs, including photography, to survive, I thank God who crowned my efforts with good success", Eke said while presenting his valedictory speech.

At the Postgraduate level, the University graduated a total of 2,023 students.

365 of them received Doctor of Philosophy Degrees (Ph.D) 1,419 received Masters Degrees while 239 graduates were awarded Postgraduate Diplomas. Professor Igwe Charles Arinzechukwu won the Vice-Chancellor's Research Leadership Prize. Vice-Chancellor's Faculty Postgraduate Prizes were won by Ibout Johnson Cletus,

Faculty of Physical Sciences (1st Prize); Chukwu Jude Okechukwu, Faculty of Social Sciences (2nd Prize) and Melefa Omotosho Moses, Faculty of Arts (3rd prize)

A unique aspect of the convocation was a special convocation ceremony for the conferment of Honorary Degree on Pastor Enoch Adeboye, the General Overseer of Redeemed Christian Church of God. Adeboye, who gained admission into the University of Nigeria in 1963 but left in 1966 because of the civil war crisis, was conferred a Doctorate Degree in Divinity (Honoris Causa).

"My joy knew no bounds when it became clear to me that 50 years later, I will still go with a degree of this University", the clergy said, adding that he was "grateful to God and to the authorities of the University of Nigeria".

Engineer Emeka Obiora Okwuosa, Chairman and CEO of Oilserv Limited, and a seasoned administrator, Engineer John Obinna Chukwu were equally conferred Doctor of Business Administration (Hon. DBA) and Doctor of Public Administration (Hon. DPA) respectively.

Meanwhile, many of those who were conferred Honorary Degrees and title of Professor Emeritus were Engineers. Besides Engineers Okwuosa and Chukwu, four out of seven Professors that received the title of Professor Emeritus were from the Faculty of Engineering. They included: Prof. Anthony Okey Odukwe,

Prof Samuel Onuorah Onyegegbu, Prof Francis Igboji Idike and Prof Emmanuel Uchecukwu Odigbo.

Others who received the title included: Prof. W. I. Beniah Onuigbo, Prof. Benson Omeniha Oluikpe and Prof. Samuel Nnagbo Chiejina.
