## **Themes/Sub-themes:**

The following themes are guides: Applied Linguistics: theory-practice interface; theory and practice of literature & stylistics; models of language teaching & testing, sign language, lgbo literature and history, culture, and religion; literature & gender studies; language and politics, lexicography, translation and interpreting, literary styles and paradigms of clarity, language and editing/advertising/publishing/ broadcasting, literature and climate change/economic recession, forensic linguistics, speech disorder/therapy, language planning/policy, Igbo literature and restructuring debate, Applied Linguistics and national development, Igbo literature and ICT, dramaturgy and theatricality of Igbo plays, discourse analysis, pragmatics, peace/non-killing linguistics, Igbo proverbs and non-literal language devices, Applied Linguistics in the tradition of Anasiudu, Igbo literature a la Nwadike, etc. Contributions that do not conform strictly to the listed sub-themes are welcome. Equally encouraged are inter-disciplinary approaches to the treatment of chosen topics that address issues bordering on Applied Linguistics and Literature/Stylistics.

## Abstract and full paper

Abstracts not exceeding 200 words may be submitted in English, Igbo, and other Nigerian languages, French and other European languages. Please, submit electronically as a Word document typed in single-line spacing of 12-point font, using Times New Roman, with five key words.
