ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- 1. **Authorship**: An individual may be the first or the presenting author of not more than two abstracts.
- 2. **Affiliation and contact**: Full name, email address, phone number and affiliation(s) are mandatory for each author. Indicate the presenting author for the abstract.
- 3. Language: All abstracts must be written and submitted in ENGLISH.
- 4. **Font**: Times New Roman 12, single paragraph, single-spaced in Microsoft Word.
- 5. **Originality**: Abstracts should contain new information and must not have been presented before. Review papers and project reports are also acceptable.
- 6. **Title**: The title should not exceed 15 words. Capitalize only the first word and proper nouns in the title.
- 7. **Body**: Maximum of 300 words (authors, contacts and title not included). Abstract must be structured to reflect the article content including background (study objectives, hypothesis tested, or description of problem), methodology, results (in summarized form, must include data and/or substantial information about results, but **do not** include tables, graphs or pictures) and conclusion/recommendation. Do not include references.
- 8. **Abbreviation**: Specify all abbreviations in full at the first mention, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses. Use the abbreviation thereafter.
- 9. **Presentation Format:** Indicate preferred presentation format (oral or poster presentation). All oral presentations for accepted abstracts must be in PowerPoint format.
- 10. Deadline for submission is 31st March, 2019.
- 11. Abstracts must be sent as attachments to the Secretariat email, sgs.abstract@unn.edu.ng
 Please use the subtheme(s) relevant to your abstract as the subject line of the email.

 Abstracts that cut across one or more subthemes are encouraged.
