### Rationale

Insights matter. However, insights from various relevant sources, with wider perspectives matter even more. Since insights from single disciplines have led to developments in each of those disciplines, would it not be worthwhile [in an era when humanity has moved from (human) development to sustainable development] to harvest and connect richer insights from across various disciplines? This question is at once exciting and inviting; and it is the rationale for the 2019 School of General Studies Conference, University of Nigeria, Nsukka. Having reflected on the role of the General Studies Programme in Development in Africa (during our conference in 2016), the organizers of the 2019 conference aim to further interrogate how the inter- /cross-disciplinary nature of the General Studies Programme enables students, lecturers and researchers to develop crossdisciplinary inquiry mind-set. It is not in doubt that several development efforts have resulted to unforeseen anti-human/environmental consequences, partly because perspectives from other disciplines were not considered while developing the seeds of those development efforts. - Affiliation and contact: Full name, email address, phone number and affiliation(s) are mandatory for each author. Indicate the presenting author for the abstract.
- Language: All abstracts must be written and submitted in English.
- Font: Times New Roman 12, single paragraph, single-spaced in Microsoft Word.
- **Originality**: Abstracts should contain new information and must not have been presented before. Review papers and project reports are also acceptable.
- **Title:** The title should not exceed 15 words. Capitalize only the first letter and proper nouns in the title.
- **Body**: Maximum of 300 words (authors, contacts and title not included). Abstract must be structured to reflect the article content including background (study objectives, hypothesis tested, or description of problem), methodology, results (in summarized form, must include data and/or substantial information about results, but **do not** include tables, graphs or pictures) and conclusion/recommendation. Do not include references.
- **Abbreviation**: Specify all abbreviations in full at the first mention, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses. Use the abbreviation thereafter.
- **Presentation Format:** Indicate preferred presentation format (oral or poster presentation). All oral presentations for accepted abstracts must be in PowerPoint format.
- Deadline for submission is 31st March, 2019.
