

The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria, Prof Benjamin Ozumba on June 26, 2016, led a delegation from the University of Nigeria to Swedish universities for discussions on possible collaborations in the areas of academic and research corporations.

The visit was on the invitation of Dr. Andreas Gothenberg, the Executive Director of Swedish

Foundation for International Cooperation in Research and Higher Education (STINT).

In the Vice-Chancellor's entourage were Professor Kenneth Ofokansi, Director, Research and International Collaboration and Professor Joy Ezeilo of the Faculty of Law whose earlier private visits to Sweden provided the initial impetus to seek collaboration with Swedish universities.

During the visit the delegation

from the University of Nigeria was hosted first by Dr. Gothenberg who revealed to the UNN team that STINT had a number of programs to support academic cooperation in all fields of learning between Swedish and non-European universities.

Other Swedish universities that played host to the UNN delegation included Uppsala University, Stockholm University, KTH Royal

imprints they left in the sand of time have continued to evoke nostalgic memories in their students and admirers who would rather address them in the present tense because their legacies live on. Eminent Nigerians paid glowing tributes to the iconic scholars at a separate memorial lectures organised by the Faculties of Arts and the Biological Sciences.

Tagged, "In the Service of the Arts: in the Service of Culture and Nation", the Chinua Achebe Biennial Memorial lecture attracted the likes of the former

Chukwuma-Eneh; Senator Chukwuka Utazi (Enugu North); and the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Ozumba who was the Chief Host of the occasion. The then Dean, Faculty of Arts, Prof. Pat Okpoko led staff and students of the faculty and discussants from sister universities to Princess Alexandra Auditorium, the venue of the lecture.

In his lecture on Achebe's view on leadership, Mr. Peter Obi said that Achebe's insistence on quality leadership in the country, made

felt did not measure up to his standard of governance. The ex-governor regretted that Nigerians would rather celebrate politicians who loot the nation's treasury, than honour patriotic and morally upright citizens like Achebe. "I agree that Nigeria is a corrupt country, but we are all involved", he said

Mr Obi's appraisal of Achebe's position on leadership was buttressed by Justice Chukwuma-Eneh who noted that Nigeria needed a charismatic leader who is sound in learning and character to

engender the kind of leadership envisioned by Chinua Achebe. Senator Chukwuka Utazi, who chaired the event, described Achebe as a “repository of high principles and sobering voice for rectitude in public service”. He stated that Achebe's comments on national issues carried weight and caused positive changes.

“Reading Achebe's work is soothing”, said the Senator, “his language is one that has a serenity and refreshing simplicity and yet appeals to every generation in its profundity”.

For the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Benjamin Ozumba, the mention of Achebe evoked the sense of cultural dignity of the African man. Ozumba, who spoke through the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, (Administration) Prof. Charles Igwe, noted that the theme of the lecture highlighted Achebe's belief in using arts to sustain cultural values and social justice of

the African man.

The former Dean, Faculty of Arts, University of Nigeria, Prof. Patrick Okpoko noted that Achebe was worthy of honour by the Faculty because of his giant strides in the literary world. “To literary scholars” said Prof. Okpoko “Achebe is a literary giant whose works transcend the African milieu, therefore making him a global icon”.

In a related development, the Faculty of Biological Sciences, held the 13th Eni-Njoku Memorial Lecture on Wednesday, 8 June 2016.

Eni-Njoku was the first indigenous Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria and the founding Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lagos. He died in 1974.

The lecture was graced by eminent Nigerians including Prof. Ukwu I. Ukwu, as Chairman of the occasion; former Minister of Health, Prof. Alphonsus B.C

Nwosu -Guest speaker; Professor Anya O. Anya- Special guest of honour, and Mr Macaulay Atasie, the keynote speaker. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) Prof James Ogbonna, represented the Vice-Chancellor, while the then Dean of the Faculty of Biological Sciences, Prof. Joseph Eyo, led staff and students of the Faculty to the event.

In his lecture titled; “Education, Intellectualism, Pursuit of Excellence, and National Development”, Professor Alphonsus B. C. Nwosu called for the return of schools to religious organisations in order to regain the lost standard of education in the country.

He urged state governors to borrow a leaf from “the Japanese and Singaporean examples by establishing special schools for the honing of the special skills and talents of our gifted children”.

Sustainable and Steady Power key to National Development

The Group Leader, Generation Sahara Power Group and Former MD/CEO, Egbin Thermal Power Station PLC, Engr. Michael Uzoigwe has disclosed that sustainable and steady power supply is key to the fortunes of the

manufacturing and Industrial Sector as power plays major roles in securing good and quick return on investment. This is because sustainable power supply drives industry, drives manufacturing and industrialization and impacts on engineering development.

He revealed that some factors that militated against the growth of the power sector were low power generation capacity; lack of investment in the sector; population explosion, unplanned expansion of the grid network and consequent system overload as well as lack of adequate infrastructural maintenance. Others were low transmission

capacity; obsolete operational equipment and poor energy metering.

Engr. Uzoigwe made this statement as the 16th Herbert Macaulay Memorial Lecture with the theme: Review and Gains of the Power Sector Reform in Nigeria. The conference which was organized by the Faculty of Engineering, University of Nigeria, Nsukka took place at the Princess Alexandra Auditorium, UNN.

He added that the power sector reform in Nigeria would open a channel for growth in the industry if well managed. While noting that the power sector reform in Nigeria should have progressed better but for the following challenges

ranging from; Failure to deploy more credible information and data from onset; slow rate of increase in generation capacity; low market tariff that discouraged investors from investing in the system; inadequate in-depth knowledge of regulation practice in our clime, inability to properly monitor progress and re-adjust when expected results are not met; semi-autonomous nature of regulator; Inadequate gas supply; Wrong mind-set of consumers, bad attitude to power supply business and unstable National security situations that drive away investors.

Engr. Uzoigwe further said that

there was need to develop alternative fuels for the sector. Stressing that coal was the immediate alternative although there were funding challenges developing coal plants.

Moreover, he advised that Engineers should be appointed to manage engineering concerns.

"The industry regulators must have the right combination of commercial and technical representation so that brighter and cognizant decisions could be reached sooner than later. We cannot leave investors in power generation to source gas for themselves rather we must increase the domestic gas obligation quantity to encourage more

investment in Power plants as well as find ways of making gas available for power generation", he said.

He therefore recommended that subsidy should be introduced to help investors recover losses until the electricity market achieves more stable liquidity; government to appoint regulators that have relevant cognate local experience and give them the required autonomy and free hand to operate.

Engr. Uzoigwe also urged Universities to introduce relevant professional courses tailored towards practical experience in the power sector.

Nigeria: A Nation Richly Endowed with Musical Heritage

A call has been made for the proper harnessing of the Nigeria's cultural heritage to richly promote the production of various genres of music.

This call was made by the Keynote Speaker, Prof. Agatha Onwuekwe, at the 3rd Biennial National Conference of Music and the Performing Art (NACOMPA), University of Nigeria, with the theme: Five Decades of Music and Performing Arts in Nigeria.

She said that a lot of development has taken place within the five decades of art music and the performing arts in Nigeria which has no sharp contrast between one decade and the other.

Further, She pointed out that art music goes *pari passu* with performance thus music must first be conceived, composed and finally be interpreted through performance.

Prof. Onwuekwe advised composers and musicians to emphasise more on the elements of Nigerian

Indigenous music which makes Nigerians feel more at home. She added that to avoid retrogression, there should always be an improvement on the art music practices and performance.

Speaking at the occasion, the Vice-Chancellor, University of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba appreciated NACOMPA conference which provided the platform where Nigerian musicologists, musicians and performing artist converge to share ideas beyond their musical boundaries.

Prof. Ozumba echoed that the University of Nigeria was the first University in Nigeria to establish a Department of Music right from

her inception thus the five decades of music and performing arts coincides with the five decades and six years the University has existed as the first indigenous University. According to him, the NACOMPA conference fits the University's vision and mission of being society oriented which garners ideas to enrich Nigeria's music product which is one of her highest exports. The lead paper presenter Prof. Cyprian Chiduo Obadigwe explained that a creative personality is a summation of three factors which includes the Intuitive, discursive and active.

He further enunciated, that the active factor is the emotional practical actions of man, the discursive consists of the rational, indirect logical cognition while the intuitive describes, though it is the chiefly sensual intuition akin to man.

He opined that the experience of history testifies that artistic ability can be developed or conversely lost, but can never be acquired because it stems from nature as though programmed in the genotype of the personality

The Obi of Onitsha, HRM, Igwe Alfred Nnaemeka Achebe has endowed a trust fund valued at N2 Million for Chimedie Museum prize for creative excellence in Visual Arts. The traditional ruler announced the endowment at a national colloquium on Uche Okeke organised by the Department of Fine and Applied Arts, University of Nigeria, Nsukka.

Under the fund, the best creative visual artist from the Department of Fine and Applied Arts, UNN, would receive a cash prize of N100,000 and mount a solo

exhibition at the commercial city of Onitsha. The traditional ruler said he instituted the prize in the spirit of promoting arts and culture in Africa and the world.

Igwe Achebe described Uche Okeke as a “renowned artist of immense creative industry and visionary actor par excellence”, who used the “traditional Uli arts as a viable resource for synthesising a modern artistic language”.
