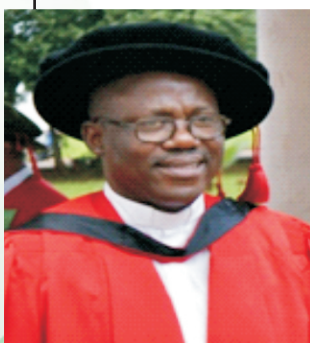

It was a sports fiesta of fun and laughter as both the Primary and Secondary Schools of the University of Nigeria had their separate Inter-house sports competitions.

In the University School, the Hibiscus House also known as the Red House emerged the overall best in the competition having clinched 200 points. Morning Glory (Blue house) came second position with 188 points while Zinna (Green house) got the 3rd position with 154 points at the 2016 Bi-ennial Inter-house Sports Competition of the University School which held at the Akanu Ibiam Stadium, UNN.

Other houses which competed were Lily House (White); Allamanda House (Yellow) and Rose House (Pink).

The Vice-Chancellor, University of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Charles Igwe in his speech revealed that sports helped in the development of the behaviour of a child and as such sporting activities

should be promoted in schools.

Also the Chairman, Board of Governors, Prof. (Mrs) C. I. Oreh in her welcome address said that sports had come to be valued not just as an entertainment and improvement of the physical well-being, but also for the exposure it gives and the enormous wealth it brings.

She continued “sports unite more than anything else and that it is the University School standard that emphasis should be given towards meeting the demands of the three domains recognized by the educational enterprise (cognitive, affective and psychomotor).

Prof. Oreh also lauded the doggedness of the board members, the sports committee as well as the teaching and non-teaching staff for working tirelessly and also appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for his continued support.

Meanwhile, the wife of the Vice-Chancellor, Pharm. Chinelo Ozumba, who was represented by Prof. Chika Oguonu said that the importance of sports cannot be over emphasized. As the Patron of Rose House, she reiterated that

“Inter house sports competition encourages children to participate actively in sports as this will enable them live healthy, think healthy and work healthy. It gives them the wonderful opportunity to develop physically, mentally and socially. Through sports, all the potentials in a developing child is brought to fore. These include the child's managerial ability, psychological endowment and disposition to human relationship, tolerance and self-discipline”.

She noted that a sporting child is a friendly child admired by all and that the competitive spirit usually expressed during competition is unequalled. According to her, this type of spirit can quickly be adopted by a sporting child in his/her academic pursuits, thereby seeing academic activities as healthy competition.

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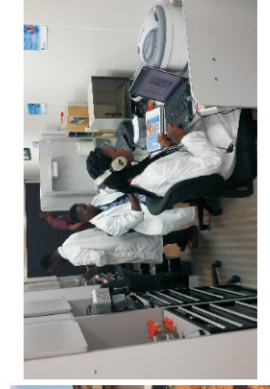


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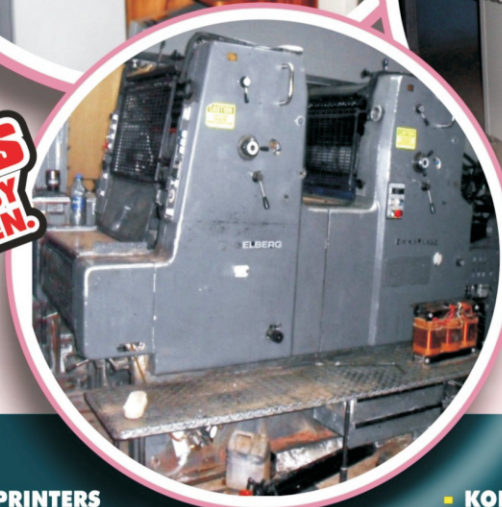
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
