## VC Unveils MASCOT for WAUG-UNN 2015

As part of the preparation for the 14<sup>th</sup> edition of the West Africa University Games scheduled to hold in the University of Nigeria, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba has unveiled the Mascot meant to serve as official symbol for the games.

The Mascot was unveiled during a lunch with the Vice-Chancellor and media executives at the Presidential Lodge, University of Nigeria, Nsukka

Prof Ozumba explained that the WAUG UNN, which is billed to hold by October 2015, would feature football (Men) and hockey (men and women).

Tracing the history of the games, Prof Ozumba said it started in 1965 to help promote peace and cooperation among youth in the West African sub-region, as well as provide platform for sports development and inter-cultural mix among university students.

The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria, Prof Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba has taken delivery of a new computerised UNN/ Access Bank Branded Students' Identity Cards.

Prof Ozumba received the first batch of the new ID cards in his office on Thursday, July 30, 2015.

He appreciated the management of Access Bank for interfacing in the production of the Identity Cards and said he looked forward to the delivery of the rest of the cards as soon as possible. The new ID cards are customized to also serve as Automated Teller Machine (ATM) Cards to the students which will be valid until the end of

their programmes in the University.

Students who are issued with the cards can decide to open an account with Access Bank Plc, from where they can pay their school fees and perform other banking transactions. The President of the Students' Union Government, UNN, Comrade Oji Peter Ekene, who led a team of SUG Officials at the presentation ceremony, appreciated the University management for their efforts at actualising the dream of students' ID cards.

It is hoped that by the end of next semester, all students' ID cards would be in place.

## **UNN holds SERVICOM Workshop**

The Service Compact with all Nigerians (SERVICOM) Unit, University of Nigeria, Nsukka recently held a SERVICOM sensitization workshop for all staff of the University at the Princess Alexandra Auditorium, UNN.

The University of Nigeria, Nsukka, Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Benjamin Ozumba, said he was elated to organize the workshop bearing in mind that SERVICOM is expected of every public servant. Stressing that the workshop would mark a turning point in the administration of the University as it hinges on ethical standards.

Prof. Ozumba reinstated that the University was keeping its own part of the Charter and urged people to know their rights while emphasizing that any memo sent to an office should be replied within 48 hours. He disclosed that SERVICOM was based on the University's core value which was "Integrity, Accountability and Transparency; where the interest of the university will be placed above all

Also, the Chairman of the occasion and Director, Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and Innovation, UNN, Dr. Olisa Okeke in his opening remarks said "our overall aim is to improve the university service delivery from the lowest to the highest cadre". He revealed that there would be key performance indicator to supervise all staff. Hence, it would be monitored for the progress of the University.

Meanwhile, the Director, SERVICOM, Prof. Chikelue Ofuebe said that SERVICOM was all about service delivery and staff welfare. Noting that the Vice-Chancellor's concern for her staff necessitated the workshop.

According to the 1<sup>st</sup> Paper presenter Corp Marshal, Federal Road Safety Corps, Nigeria, Boboye Oyeyemi, in his paper titled "Discipline: Towards an enhanced service delivery in an organization, (FRSC as a Case Study)", said that discipline was the only thing necessary to achieve any goal worth having.

other considerations. Decisions will be guided by deep sense of honesty, truth, equity and justice. The highest standard of ethical and moral values will be exhibited and encouraged".

He added that his administration would "treat everyone fairly and justly, regardless of creed, colour, gender and race/tribe".

In his words, "Discipline in an organization is the pattern of shared values, belief and rules or pattern of common behavior in the organization. Discipline is the structure and order within an individual or within a group for true cooperation, real support of the mission and the members of the team or organization".

Furthermore, he noted that organizational discipline was an essential management tool necessary for the smooth and effective functioning of the organization.

"It facilitates efficiency, streamlines the operations of the organization and helps the organization to move forward. An organization devoid of discipline would be a mess of resources and nothing more because discipline is required for any activity where people work together towards a common objective", he said.

Boboye continued that organization discipline, once instilled in the employees, would help in getting the best out of them. This would in turn lead to protection, improve performance, promote appropriate behavior, efficiency, fairness, ensure safety and peaceful behavior.

## UNN Hosts African VCs, Deans of Science, Engineering & Tech

The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba, has announced that the University of Nigeria will host the 6<sup>th</sup> African Regional Conference of Vice-Chancellors and Deans of Science, Engineering and Technology (COVIDSET).

Prof. Ozumba made the announcement while addressing a press conference at the University of Nigeria, Enugu Campus (UNEC) on Thursday July 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

The ideas, according to Prof.
Ozumba, would enhance Africa's global competitiveness and help in developing strategies and actions that would improve the standard of university education in the continent.

The Vice-Chancellor outlined subthemes of the conference to include: State of Science, Engineering, Technology and Innovation (SETI) Education in African, challenges and opportunities Post 2015;

According to him, the conference would hold at Nike Lake Resort, Enugu, from October 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> 2015 with over 350 participants expected to be in attendance.

"The University of Nigeria will be the first University in Nigeria to host such prestigious African conference in Nigeria. The conference will indeed offer us a good opportunity to show-case Nigeria and her rich potentials", he said.

The Vice-Chancellor explained that the last five COVIDSET conferences were held in Ghana (2005), South Africa (2007, Uganda (2009) South Africa (2011) and Botswana (2013).

Further, Prof. Ozumba stated that the COVIDSET 2015 would provide a platform for University leaders to crossbreed ideas and experiences on emerging trends in Science, Engineering, Technology and Innovation (SETI).

Climate Change and sustainable development: the role of research institutions and universities in Africa; making SETI relevant for youth employability Post 2015; and Research Commercialization and Higher Education Financing.

Prof Ozumba listed participants expected at the conference to include: leaders of institutions responsible for teaching research in African countries, Deans of Faculty and Heads of Academic Department in African Universities; and agencies and companies involved in the promotion of Science, Engineering and Technology in Africa.

Presenting the award at the Vice-Chancellor's conference room, UNN, the Coordinator of NANS Zone- B, Comrade Okorie Ikechukwu, said that Prof. Ozumba was singled out for the award because of his contributions to the growth of education in the country.

"We can without any equivocation bear testimony to the fact that Professor Ozumba has always supported any cause that will uplift education as well as whatever that will accelerate the pace of socio-economic transformation of Nigeria", he said.

While describing the Vice-Chancellor as an apostle of positive change, the NANS Coordinator called for the involvement of Nigerian youth in governance to enable them expend their energy in nation building.

In his response, Prof Ozumba thanked NANS for the award, stating that he was happy that his contributions to the development of education in the country were recognised by students, who he described as members of his primary constituency

. The Vice-Chancellor, Who assumed office in June 2014, said he considered the award a celebration of his one year in office.

He noted that his interest in the welfare of students dated back to his undergraduate years in the University of Lagos where he made his mark as an activist.

"While serving as a Dean and the Provost, College of Medicine, I continued to fight for and protected the interest of my students", he said

A top leading power plant in Africa, Egbin Power Plant PLC Lagos recently commissioned and handed over a Feed Water Heater Project to the Department of Mechanical Engineering, University of Nigeria, Nsukka. The event took place at the Faculty of Engineering Building in UNN.

While commissioning the project, the Head, Media and Community Relations, Egbin Power PLC, Mr. Kingsley Okotie said "History has been made as UNN and Egbin solidify their partnership to benefit mankind and to promote the advancement of knowledge. He said, that as a company which prides itself as the single largest power generating company of Africa, it also helps to effect change in the society".

The Vice-Chancellor, University of Nigeria, Nsukka, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba who received the project on behalf of the University was represented by the University Council Member, Prof. Charles Igwe.

He commended the Management Board of Egbin Company for making a giant stride not only in the power sector in Sub- Sahara Africa but for also extending their magnanimity to UNN. The Vice-Chancellor also solicited for more project development in the nearest future, adding that the project would be used for lecturing and effective research.

The Head, Department of Mechanical Engineering, Engr. Dr. Stephen Nwanya emphasized that the equipment would be used in teaching power plant Engineering courses in order to convey a deeper sense of understanding of Power Plant in the Faculty.

Engr. Nwanya who expressed a sense of fulfillment said that there was hope for future robust Engineering teaching and research in the area of power station, design construction and maintenance. He also appreciated the Company on behalf of the Department and enjoined other Power Companies in Nigeria to emulate the noble example of Egbin Power Plant in assisting the academic sector to promote the educational system in Nigeria.

Prof. Iloeje Onwuamaeze, a lecturer in the Department of Mechanical Engineering explained that the Water Heater is used to raise the temperature of the water that goes into the power plant for effective use of the plant. He lauded the management of Egbin for her kind gesture while stressing that he normally takes his students on a field trip to Egbin power plant for better understanding of their courses.

#### UNN Vice-Chancellor's Mandate Spurs up Impact Factor Workshops

As part of the mandate of the Vice-Chancellor, University of Nigeria Nsukka, Prof. Benjamin Ozumba on Impact factor reward scheme, the Department of Political Science organized a workshop to enlighten her Post graduate students on Impact Factor writing.

The one day seminar with the theme "Advanced Research Methodology Training" held at the Continuing Education Center (C.E.C), Niger Hall, UNN". According to the Head, Department of Political Sciences, Prof Jonah Onuoha, the workshop was aimed at educating the Post Graduate students of the Department on how to carry out research and write publishable articles. He also promised to do same for staff members.

The Chairman of the Workshop and Dean, School of Post Graduate Studies, Prof. Augustine Ubachukwu revealed that writing is an art that needs to be learnt as some are more gifted than others.

According to him, "writing quality article is obtainable via adequate research training as training is the bed rock of solid article writing". While emphasizing that the reason why most Professors travel in and out of the country is because their research work speaks for them.

Meanwhile, Prof. Okechukwu Ibeanu who delivered a lecture titled "General Overview of Research Methodology" told the Post Graduate students that a Ph. D Holder has a mandate to contribute to knowledge and his discipline.

He emphasized that to be a scientist or researcher one must either have formulated a theory or tested an existing one to become eligible in the world of science. Furthermore, he enumerated that the two ways a scientist could test a theory was either through falsifying or verifying the theory.

Prof. Ibeanu mentioned that a social scientist believes that the real deal was to falsify a theory but though the end result is that scientists try to refurbish poor and weak knowledge to a better one.

Also, Rev. Fr. (Prof.) Hyacinth Ichoku in his lecture titled "Writing for Impact Factor Journals", stated that the reasons why people write for Impact factor Journals was to attract promotion, to be recognized by peers and to disseminate research findings.

Prof. Ichoku further gave hints on research guidelines when writing for Impact Factor Journals which are finding an appropriate journal for publication, knowing your readers, publishers and Editors and reading the authors instructions specified by the Journal.

VC Inaugurates TVET Research Group

A new research group, with focus on innovations in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), was recently inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Chukwuma Ozumba.

Inaugurating the research group on-behalf of the Vice-Chancellor, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration) Prof. Edwin Igbokwe commended the Vice-Chancellor for encouraging formation of research groups in the University.

"It is no longer a one man's show but group effort" he said while applauding the group for setting the pace for formal inaugurations of research groups in the Institution.

Prof Igbokwe advised the group to always convoke short discussion sessions that would offer members opportunities to crossbreed ideas and generate research problems.

He recommended that the group should clearly define the role of each member involved in a research effort in order to avoid possible dissention that might arise from grant project execution.

Prof. Hyacinth Ichoku, who represented the Chairman of Research Grant

Committee, UNN, explained that the need to motivate people to work and get results made the Vice-Chancellor to approve the release of N100, 000 as seed money to each of the over 206 research groups in the University.

He revealed that following the Vice-Chancellor's institution of reward incentives for academic publications in Thomson Reuter's Impact Factor Journals, about 32 academics have published in the journals within the last few months.

Prof. Ichoku congratulated the TVET Research Group on formation of the group and urged them to pursue their objective with passion.

Coordinator of the Innovations in TVET Research Group, Prof Emmanuel Osinem, said the prompting of the Vice-Chancellor has led to the formation and revival of many research groups in the Institution.

"This is a significant shift from one man show to more corporate or semi corporate group efforts which funders are more inclined to. This in no small measure will kindle efforts of many scholars, thus enhancing volume and quality of researches and publications including outreach services", the Coordinator said.

Prof Osinem stated that the mission of the group was to "become a leading research group in transforming formal and informal TVET practices through system innovation generation".

He said that although the group was formally inaugurated recently by the Vice-Chancellor; it had already submitted five proposals to potential funders in the last few months.

Prof Osinem, outlined some of the objectives of the group to include: to undertake researches in TVET systems innovation, programme delivery and best practices in skills development/training in the formal and non-informal settings; to conduct skills gap analysis of emerging occupations for evaluation of novel training programmes, and to carry out TVET policy analysis and dialogue with stakeholders.

The Coordinator explained that membership of the group was open to interested scholars within and outside the University, provided the person would be willing to initiate and possibly supervise a project.

"Members have equal opportunities in evolving ideas in developing projects while the originator becomes the leader/principal investigator in the project", he added.

He listed some funding opportunities open to the group to include: Higher Education Academic Network, UNESCO-UNEVOC eforum, Erasmus Mundus Academic Mobility Network, and Innovation in Vocational Education and Training (IVET) network.

29,985 candidates shortlisted for UNN's PUTME

No fewer than 21,580 candidates who chose the University of Nigeria as first choice in the 2015 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) are expected to participate in the University's Computer Based Test (CBT) scheduled to hold from 11<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> August 2015.

The Chairman of the University's Entrance Board, Prof. Thomas Mmuoemne. Okonkwo, said the figure represented the total number of candidates who selected the University as their first choice and scored at least 200 in the UTME.

Prof. Okonkwo explained that JAMB had earlier shortlisted about 11, 585 candidates for the University, but the figure increased following Federal Government's override of JAMB's reposting policy.

On why the University of Nigeria choose to conduct Computer-Based Test for the candidates, Prof Okonkwo said it was cost effective, convenient, and in tune with advancement in modern technology

"The University of Nigeria has the facilities: the holding capacity of our ICT park is above 1000, so we can conduct the screening exercise for at least 4000 candidates in four hours", he said.

Dr Okeke said although the University had made provision for over 11, 000 candidates earlier sent by JAMB, the increase in number would not affect the smooth conduct of the exercise.

He said that over 1000 laptop computers connected to the internet had been provided for the screening, stating that his staff would be on ground to address any complain that might arise from the candidates.

According to Information posted in the University's website, the screening exercise would be conducted in two batches.

The Batch 1, would be for candidates, whose names had appeared in the first list earlier sent by JAMB, while Batch B would be for those whose names were included in the second list.

It also stated that registration for candidates whose names fall under Batch 1 would end on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2015, while their screening would commence from 11<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> August, 2015.

Registration for candidates in Batch 2 would end on 12<sup>th</sup> of August, while their screening would start from 17<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> of August 2015.
