Notes to contributors:

Well researched manuscripts should be submitted using the following guidelines:

Abstract: this should not be more than 200 words. Each abstract should reflect the following: problem of the study, objectives, methodology, finding and conclusion/recommendations, with 4-6 keywords.

The main text: this should be broken down into Introduction, Literature Review, Method, Result/Discussion, and Conclusions/Recommendations/Implications.

References: APA Referencing Style Sheet (6th Edition) is acceptable.

Structure: The manuscript should be in 12 points, Times New Romans, double line spacing, and not more than 6000 words. Figures and tables should be well titled, with their respective sources.

Plagiarism: Contributors are strongly advised to submit original works that are not plagiarized as they will be held responsible for any plagiarized content in their manuscripts. Work submitted to this book project should also not be under consideration in other publishing outlets.
