CALL FOR PAPERS

Contemporary global human society has her good and bad news. Some of the good news relate to continuous improvements in development indices, life expectancy, access to information in real time, speedy tracking of diseases by sequencing the DNA of primary causal agents, ease of tracking sources of insecurity, massive improvements in higher education outputs, improved structures that ensure more accountable politics, and so on. Some of the bad news include retrogressive return to populism and nationalism, fear of human extinction due to advanced AI- systems, increased violence, racial and neoracial discriminatory activities, and so on. Between these good and bad indices on a global scale, it is crucial to continue to explore how specifically Africa is fairing and what the continent is contributing to both sides of the news. And beyond arguments by Africanists and Afro-centrists in praise of traditional societies in Africa, how can societies in Africa improve accountability in politics, better outputs from institutions of higher education, better security, and overall improvement in human wellbeing? Put another way, what are the issues that are preventing African states from improving their indices in these four regards? These two questions capture the rationale for this conference. To explore answers to these questions, we invite researchers and practitioners from all fields of study and from around the globe, to join us in exploring some of the causal issues behind the state of contemporary Africa in terms of politics, higher education, security management, and development. Prospective contributors can be guided by the following sub-themes:

- 12. Higher education, technologies, social movements, and social change
