

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

International Conference on "Corporate Entities, Innovations and Technologies"

Corporate entities are increasingly in the spotlight in light of the explosion of innovations and technologies as well as their role in national, regional and global businesses. While corporate entities are leveraging technological and innovative solutions to deliver state of the art services, they equally encounter constraints that challenge their competitiveness.
