Established to address sustainability development challenges in sub-Saharan Africa, the International Conference on Water in Africa (ICWA) has, for its first ten years, the goal of mobilizing, motivating and moving stakeholders to explore the Prime Place of Water Towards the Successful Delivery the SDGs in sub-Saharan Africa.

WORKSHOPS

Water Workshop: Water testing and treatment is key for disease control in rural environments. Supported by International Water and Health Alliances (IWHA), our annual water workshop is designed to equip participants with both knowledge and skills to train communities on deploying evidence-based Microbiology and water-testing kits as educational tools that demonstrate the best practices for identifying safe drinking water.

Writing Workshop: Writing is a critical tool for sustainable development, and the focus of our annual writing workshop cohorts, organised in collaboration with the Michigan State University's Global Alliances in Literacy and Engagement (GALE), is on developing capacity in academic and grant writing amongst early career researchers in sub-Saharan Africa.
